John Bishop, Arbitrator

John Bishop is a member of Arbitration Chambers, Hong Kong and London. Arbitration Chambers has amongst its members many of the world's leading arbitrators. John has more than 40 years' experience as a construction lawyer. He now practices as an Arbitrator, Mediator & Dispute Board Member. He is a panel member of many leading arbitration institutions.

Doug Clark, Barrister, Gilt Chambers, Hong Kong and Adjunct Professor, University of Hong Kong

Doug Clark is a barrister and arbitrator practising in Hong Kong. He has handled competition law related cases for over 15 years. Doug was formerly the managing partner of international law firm Hogan Lovells' Shanghai office. He has acted in a number of major SEP licensing disputes and has recently acted for a number of clients in relation to NDRC investigations and Anti-Monopoly Law lawsuits relating to licensing practices. Doug is an Adjunct Professor at the University of Hong Kong and the author of a number of legal texts as well as a history of British and American extraterritoriality in China and Japan between 1842 and 1943. He speaks Mandarin Chinese and Japanese.

Boaz Moselle, Executive Vice President, Compass Lexecon, UK

Boaz Moselle is an Executive Vice President at Compass Lexecon based in London. He is an economist who has worked in academia, consulting and government. His areas of expertise include the assessment of damages in disputes involving natural gas, LNG, conventional and renewable power generation and other forms of energy. He has provided expert witness testimony in approximately 50 international arbitrations, in the context of both commercial and investment treaty disputes. Who's Who Legal 2017 notes that "Boaz Moselle draws praise for his 'exceptional genius' and prowess in gas-pricing disputes", and that "one client describes him as 'the best expert I have ever seen under cross-examination, and possibly the brightest I have seen in my whole career.'"

Dr. Moselle began his career as an assistant professor at Northwestern University. He holds a Ph.D. in Economics from Harvard University, and an M.A. and Ph.D. in Mathematics from the Universities of Cambridge and London. He was previously a Managing Director of the UK energy regulator Ofgem. He teaches in the Brussels School of Competition on competition and regulation, and as a guest lecturer at Queen Mary University of London School of Law on issues related to damages and disputes in the energy industry.

Charlie Manzoni Q.C., 39 Essex Chambers

As a qualified Mechanical and Electrical Engineer, Charles worked in the international development department of a multi-national blue chip industrial company for five years before qualifying as a lawyer and entering private practice. Charles's work involves mainly international litigation, arbitration and mediation across a broad spectrum of commercial work. Dr. Li Hu is the Deputy Secretary General of China International Economic and Trade Arbitration Commission (CIETAC). He is a Panel Member (Mediator) of the Mediation Center of China Council for the Promotion of International Trade (CCPIT), and also a Panel Member (Arbitrator) of China International Economic and Trade Arbitration Commission (CIETAC), China Maritime Arbitration Commission (CMAC), Hong Kong International Arbitration Center (HKIAC), National Arbitration Forum (NAF, USA), the International Arbitration Court at the Chamber of Commerce and Industry of the Republic of Kazakhstan, Kuala Lumpur Regional Center for Arbitration (KLRC), the Arbitration Foundation of Southern Africa (AFSA) and Cairo Regional Center for International Commercial Arbitration (CRCICA).

As presiding arbitrator, co-arbitrator and sole arbitrator, Dr. Li has awarded more than 110 domestic and international arbitration cases, including arbitration under ICC Rules and UNCITRAL Rules. As the author, co-author and translator of many arbitration books and arbitration articles, he frequently speaks at international or domestic arbitration conferences and activities.
