Prof Benjamin Hughes, Independent Arbitrator and Associate Professor, Seoul National University School of Law

Professor Benjamin Hughes is an independent arbitrator, associate professor at Seoul National University School of Law, and resident of The Arbitration Chambers in Singapore. He has extensive prior experience as counsel in international arbitrations around the world and under most major arbitration rules. He practiced international arbitration at a large US firm (in the US and Singapore), and was the founding co-chair of the international dispute resolution practice group at one of Korea's oldest and largest full service law firms. Ben ceased practice as a lawyer and has practiced as an independent arbitrator and mediator since March 2013. Since then, he has been appointed as the sole, chair or co-arbitrator in arbitrations under rules of the ICC, SIAC, HKIAC, UNCITRAL, KLRCA, CIETAC, ACICA and KCAB, as well as ad-hoc arbitrations. He is a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators, the Singapore Institute of Arbitrators, the Hong Kong Institute of Arbitrators and the Australian Centre for International Commercial Arbitration. He is Chair of the Korea Chapter of CIARB, Executive Committee Member of the Seoul International Dispute Resolution Center, Member of the International Arbitration Committee of the KCAB, and Director of the Korean Council for International Arbitration. He also serves on the editorial boards of the Journal of Korean Law at SNU Law School and the Korean Arbitration Review of the KCAB.

Sungbae Ji President, Korean Commercial Arbitration Board (KCAB)

Sungbae Ji is the 9th president of the Korean Commercial Arbitration Board (KCAB). He graduated from Korea University with LL. B. in 1978. He completed the master's course at Public Administration in Graduate School of Public Administration in Seoul National University in 1982. He also completed the doctor's course in Public Administration at Hansung University following his master's degree in Policy Studies at Graduate School of Policy Studies in Korea University.

Before joining the KCAB, he served as Deputy Secretary-General at the National Assembly of the Republic of Korea until January 2015. After passing the Examination for Legislative Officials in 1982, he had served as Senior Professional Advisor in Industry, Trade & Energy Committee and Agriculture, Food, Oceans & Fishery Committee at the National Assembly of the Republic of Korea. With his work at the National Assembly of the Republic of Korea, he received Commendation from the Chairman of the National Assembly in 1992, and a Medal for his merit as a public official.

Richard Wilmot-Smith Q.C., 1st Keynote Speaker, 39 Essex St Chambers, London

Richard Wilmot-Smith Q.C. has been practicing as a barrister in the field of construction and engineering and arbitration for thirty four years and has been a QC for nineteen years. He has acted as counsel in many domestic and international arbitrations both ad hoc and under rules. He has also served as joint arbitrator, sole arbitrator and chairman in international arbitrations under rules, particularly ICC, LCIA and DIAC. As arbitrator his arbitrations have involved involve food franchises, energy projects, telecommunications, intellectual property disputes, agency agreements, PFI projects and construction and engineering. He was author and now editor of the OUP publication Construction Contracts, Law and Practice; first edition 2006, third edition due March 2014. He was joint head and then head of 39 Essex Street Chambers 2003-2011.

Nicolas Wiegand, Managing Partner CMS, Hong Kong

Nicolas Wiegand has more than 10 years of experience in acting as counsel and arbitrator in more than 80 international commercial arbitrations under all major arbitration rules (among others, ICC, HKIAC, UNCITRAL, SIAC, DIAC, DIS, ASA, VIAC, SCC). Nicolas (born and raised in Switzerland, German nationality) has previously worked in Australia, the United States and Switzerland, and is now based in Hong Kong and Munich. He lectures on arbitration related matters at international conferences and teaches training courses, inter alia, for the HKIAC. His most recent practice has focused on disputes relating to, among others, IP and IT related disputes, major projects/construction, joint venture agreements, M&A transactions, gas/energy supply agreements as well as sales and distribution agreements.

He holds a PhD from the East China University of Politics and Law and Duke University, where he was a Fulbright Scholar.

He also regularly participates in conferences and seminars on international arbitration. He has published various academic articles about international arbitration and Korean law.

Arvin W. Lee, Vice-President and Interim General Counsel (Designate), Next Generation Infrastructure Group

Arvin Lee is an Arbitrator of the Korean Commercial Arbitration Board and the Beijing Arbitration Commission, and currently Vice-President and Interim General Counsel (Designate) of the Singapore side of Next Generation Infrastructure Group, a renewable energy power plant development company.
